

Tower Hotel is fairly new in the Kuala Lumpur hospitality scene. Located within the city's Golden Triangle, it is walking distance from the diplomatic area and business centre with malls such as Suria KLCC and the newly refurbished Avenue K.

Knowing that the hotel, catered to business travellers, has only three floors in GTower, we were in suspense of what to expect. However, we were pleasantly surprised when we arrived at the lobby of GTower, the checkin was at the reception area on the 11th floor. The ambience of the reception area was calming with dim yellow lights and walls adorned with photographs of nature. We were told that the photographer responsible for the pictures spent two months in Borneo as part of the assignment. As the hotel is pretty high up in the building, we could have spectacular views of the city everywhere we turned, making this feel like paradise in the sky.

The hotel is the first fully certified green and smart property is Malaysia. They make a commitment to being environment friendly without compromising personal comfort. The room boasts panaramic views of the city. It has a contemporary setting with a king-sized bed garlanded with fluffy pillows that could make you feel like sleeping on clouds. The room also has a sizeable work desk and multiple international news channels on TV. Staying true to being green, the bathroom has a rain shower with a technology that harnesses waste energy from the airconditioning system to heat the water.

For dinner, we were escorted to Tanzini on the 28th floot, an award-winning fine dining restaurant with chefs determined to infuse Asian flavours into their dishes. The food here is creatively prepared and presented, evoking our taste and optical senses in the most pleasant way.

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We were served a three-course dinner from a brand new menu that was launched the day before we were there, all scrumptious and eclectic in flavour. We especially loved the foie gras and beetroot relish on grilled ciabatta. The buttery and savoury taste of the foie gras, which melted in the mouth, was taken to new heights when mixed with the earthy sweetness of the relish. For dessert, we were served a heavenly hazelnut parfait and an assortment of housemade chocolate that was divine. With an ambience so romantic and luxurious, this was definitely one of the best meals we have had in Kuala Lumpur. They also have private rooms available upon request.







If you like post-dinner drinks, the bars in this hotel are worth a visit. The View caters to a young crowd while The Bridge is for those looking for a more mature ambience with the likes of Billie Halliday playing in the air. We were also told that The Bridge Bar is literally a bridge that connects two buildings which is a pretty cool concept for a bar.

For breakfast, we headed to The Club, a business lounge and breakfast area. The breakfast buffet had a range of local and international food, which makes for a delightful breakfast as you're spoilt for choice. We were amazed at how good the puff pastry was. The chefs here at GTower have their pastry made fresh from scratch daily. The pastry was delightfully crackly and we savoured every bite as it slowly melted in our mouth. The business area is also located here with facilities such as computers, fax and printing services available until 11 pm everyday. They also have soundproof boardrooms with in house food and beverages services available for company meetings and such.

We were reluctant to leave after a great weekend escape in the city. However, all good things must come to an end. We had a great experience from our stay in GTower Hotel and hope to revisit very soon. For those looking for the perfect city retreat, GTower Hotel is definitely worth a stay.

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
